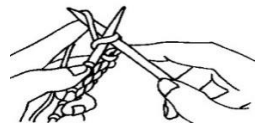

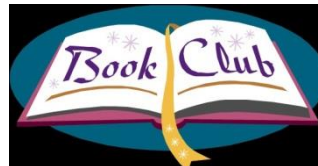

## **FEBRUARY RESIDENTS' COMMITTEE REPORT**

During December and January we had the Mt Claremont Playgroup come up and sing Xmas Carols. About 12-15 residents attended and enjoyed themselves. Our next event was the afternoon tea with Mt Claremont Pharmacy hosting a pop-up shop. The Xmas dinner went very well with 54 residents attending. Most said that the service and meal were great. This was followed by the Happy Hour where everyone enjoyed themselves. The turnout was just over 30 residents. Our final event for 2019 was New Year's Eve. We had some 25-30 persons and some stayed as late as 2AM.! Our Darts nights continued with varying support. The standard has not improved a lot. Some mentioned that perhaps another time could be chosen. If anyone has any suggestions please feel free to contact me.

We conducted a survey on traffic around Lisle Villages and got a response from 22 residents (17 from Lisle and 5 from Leaweena). The main concerns were:

1. Alfred Road speed and crossing this road (11 respondents)
2. Parked cars opposite Adderley street entrance/exit. (10 respondents)
3. New verge tree in Alfred Road will obscure traffic (1 respondent).
4. Crossing between Lisle and Leaweena and the traffic speed. (7 respondents)

Residents will be kept up to date with progress in addressing these issues.

January was a quiet month and as you all know I am the only person currently on the Residents' Committee. Corrie and Kelly will continue with the social functions and will form part of the social committee. You now have a flyer asking for nominations for the Residents Committee. Currently we have no nominations. If we do not get nominations the RC will cease to exist as it currently does.

NBN survey. We had some 6 responses to this along with a few verbal requests later. As of a week or so ago I had no NBN problems but residents had issues with their phone or laptop. About a week ago I heard of a lot of people who are having NBN problems. Basically, the internet connection drops out. This will affect the land line, web browsing and streaming. I also have experienced this but not as pronounced as many others. If the NBN is dropping out like this it appears to me that some blame resides with the service provider. Try and keep accurate records when this occurs and for how long. We may be able to help with this evidence. I note whilst writing this report from the NBN website that from 20<sup>th</sup>-25<sup>th</sup> January NBN have been working to fix a major fault in our area, so you may have experienced problems this week whilst they were carrying out their repairs. Hopefully these works will solve any current issues.

I hope 2020 has begun wonderfully for you all.

# Smoked salmon and asparagus quiche

## Ingredients

- 2 sheets frozen shortcrust pastry, thawed
- 100 gram asparagus, sliced diagonally into 1cm thick pieces
- 6 eggs
- 1/4 cup (60ml) cream
- 100 gram smoked salmon, cut into strips
- 4 green onions, white part only, sliced thinly
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh dill
- 1 cup (100g) grated mozzarella cheese

Preheat oven to 190°C/170°C fan-forced. Grease a 23cm loose-based flan tin or pie dish and line with pastry, trimming to fit the tin. Place the tin on an oven tray; prick the pastry lightly with a fork. Cover pastry with baking paper, fill with baking weights or dried beans or rice. Bake for 15 minutes; remove weights and paper, bake for a further 10 minutes or until pastry is browned lightly.

Boil, steam or microwave asparagus until just tender; drain. Whisk eggs in a medium bowl, then whisk in the cream. Season with salt and freshly ground black pepper.

Sprinkle the smoked salmon, asparagus, onion, dill and mozzarella over the pastry case. Carefully pour over the egg mixture. Bake for 25 minutes or until just set. Serve with salad, if desired.
