# Residents' Community Gardening Project

Following my June Newsletter's article enquiring as to residents' interest in helping out in Lisle & Leaweena's communal gardens, one resident expressed an interest and we are both now working on the above project.

Myself and Kaz, with the support and in consultation with Mandy, Rilla, Sean and Shane, are very much enjoying spending time in the garden beds bordering Leaweena's driveway, enhancing a tranquil space for residents and for the local fauna.



The first order of work was to prune and clear out the existing plants in the beds in order to see what was actually there and to create a framework to develop the garden. In line with Lisle's Common Garden Policy, initial plantings of waterwise, native plants have commenced, adding varieties of Melaleuca, Chorizima, Correa, Hakea, Boronia, Olearia and Everlastings to the existing Geraniums, Cliveas, Rhoeos, Frangipanis, Viburnum and Bottlebrushes. Additional native shrubs and a dwarf citrus are scheduled for planting.



With Sean's assistance, a garden bed was cleared and prepared for the relocation of Margot's vegetable patch. The initial planting was made up of Broccoli, Silverbeet, Chives, Oregano, Coriander and Artichoke, and is being added to regularly. As per Margot's original intention, the produce is freely available for residents to pick with care.



So that residents can spend time outdoors in a wind-protected, sunny spot and enjoy the gardens and the peacefulness of nature, with a bird bath tucked away for the many magpies, kookaburras and parrots who frequent the area and enjoy drinking, bathing and singing there. Discreet rocks to sunbathe on or hide under are there for the lizards too – a little away from the bird bath for the sake of the lizards' health and safety!

We respectfully request dog owners' support to keep in mind the cost of plants, some of which are vegetables for consumption others which have been raised from seed, and the care and work which has gone into developing the beds. Could you please ensure your pets are on a lead and stay out of the garden as per Lisle Villages' Pet Policy.

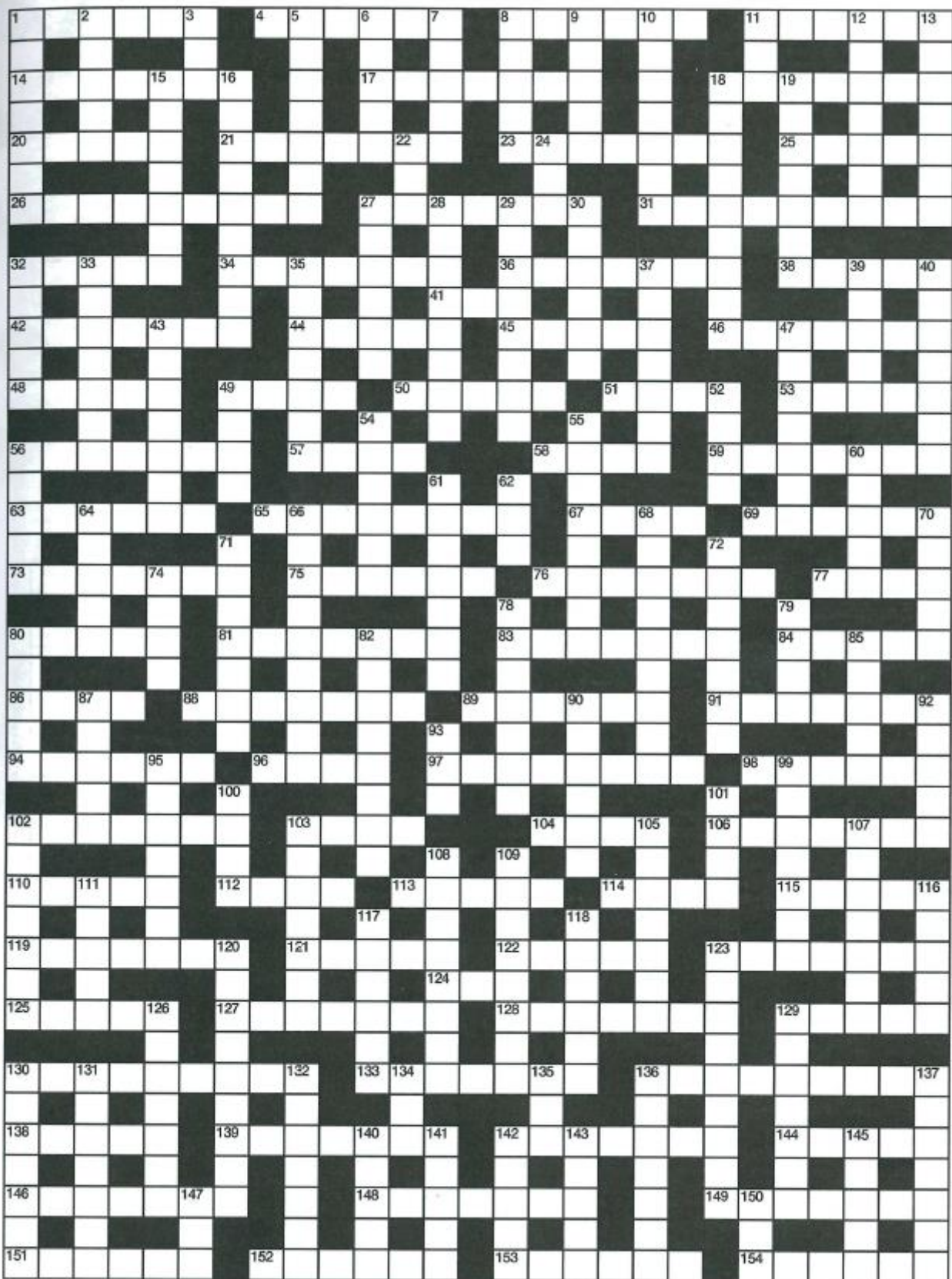
